Volcanic eruptions^(注1) can be extremely deadly. Two of the world's deadliest were in Indonesia. Together, the eruptions of Mount Tambora and Krakatoa were 27 for the deaths of hundreds of thousands of people.

Mount Tambora erupted in 1815. It was the deadliest volcanic eruption in modern history. It killed about one hundred thousand people. Over five days, Tambora spewed^(注2) fiery^(注3) ash, rock, and lava^(注4) into the air and onto the ground. The actual eruption was really terrible, but the ash continued the destruction well after Tambora stopped erupting. Ash 28 everything and destroyed all the plants on the island. The resulting starvation and disease caused an additional eighty thousand deaths. The ash affected other parts of the globe, too. It caused crops to die as far 29 as Europe and the United States.

The 1883 eruption of Krakatoa was the largest and most famous in recorded history. After months of fairly small rumblings^(注5), there was a very loud eruption. In fact, it was so loud that people heard it from more than 2,500 miles away. When survivors looked up after the eruption, they could no longer see Krakatoa because (1) it had blown itself up. It blew debris^(注6) an amazing fifty miles into the air, and ash spread across the globe. On the island, the ash filled the air in such a thick fog that it blocked out the sun for two days. But people didn't have to feel the shaking or see the ash to be affected by the eruption. The volcano crashed into the sea, causing tsunamis. These huge 30 killed more than thirty-five thousand people.

The late nineteenth century saw a growth in the study of weather and natural disasters. Technologies such as the telephone and telegraph let individuals across the globe study the eruption and share their information with extraordinary speed. These technologies made Krakatoa one of the best understood natural disasters of its time. In the past, people hardly knew what to expect, but in the future, scientists might have the technology (ア). They might even be able to predict which way lava will flow. Scientists must continue to study volcanoes so that people will be able to prepare. Until volcanoes can be absolutely understood, people should plan an escape route and 31 the area if they ever see a volcano start to rumble and spew out ash.

第4問 次の文章を読んで、下の設問に答えなさい。

When he woke up on the morning of June 23rd, 2018, Peerapat Sompiangjai, whose nickname is “night,” was excited. It was his seventeenth birthday, and his plans were to practice soccer and then have fun with friends from his team, the Wild Boars. When they fell asleep that night, however, Night and eleven of his friends felt hunger, thirst, and terror.

What happened? To celebrate Night’s birthday, the Wild Boars explored the Tham Luang cave in northern Thailand. Their coach, Ekkapol Chantawong, went with them to keep them safe. Usually it is OK to explore the cave in June, but heavy summer rains suddenly started. The cave began filling with water and the Wild Boars had to go deeper into the cave to survive. They were trapped!

When the boys did not come home that evening, their parents became worried. They found the boys’ bicycles, bags, and shoes outside the cave and raised the alarm. Soon, the story became big news around the world. Volunteers from many countries traveled to Thailand to help.

Inside the cave, the situation was not good. They had a little water, but almost no food. They did not know that people were looking for them. They did not even know what day it was or how long they had been trapped. Coach Chantawong tried to help the boys. He let them eat his share of the food, and he taught them how to meditate^(注) so they would feel less worried. He also told them to lie still in order to use less oxygen.

At last, there was good news on July 2nd, when three divers found the team alive. Around the world, people were happy to learn of their discovery. Now that divers knew the boys’ location, they could bring food, air, and medicine to them. However, the situation was not safe: the cave was full of water, the boys could not swim, and they were far from the cave entrance.

More heavy rains were expected, and the rescuers came up with a dangerous, desperate plan. First, they put diving equipment on the boys. Some divers then tied themselves to the boys and helped them swim to a dry part of the cave. Finally, more than 100 helpers took turns carrying the boys to the cave’s entrance.

The plan was very dangerous, and sadly, diver Saman Kunan died while rescuing the boys. However, despite the danger, all of the Wild Boars, including Coach Chantawong, were out of the cave and being checked by doctors by July 10th. At last, after 17 days in the cave, they were all safe.
